- **The “Glory” hymns at the end of Matins:**

THE SECOND EOTHINON DOXASTICON IN TONE TWO

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

They who were with Mary came and brought with them ointments; and as they were at a loss how to achieve their desire, they saw that the stone had been rolled, and a divine young man removed all anxiety and trouble from their souls by saying, The Lord Jesus hath risen. Wherefore, they proclaimed to His Disciples, that they should hasten to Galilee and behold Him, risen from the dead; for He is the Lord, the Giver of Life.

Both now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Most blessed art thou, O Virgin Theotokos, for through Him that was incarnate of thee is Hades despoiled, Adam is recalled from the dead, the curse is made void, Eve is set free, death is slain, and we are endowed with life. Wherefore, in hymns of praise, we cry aloud: Blessed art Thou, O Christ our God, Who is thus well pleased, glory to Thee.

- **The Divine Liturgy Hymns of the Day:**

- **The First Antiphon**

Verse: Great is the Lord and greatly to be praised: in the city of our God and in His holy mountain. Glorious things are spoken of thee, O city of God.

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

Verse: God is known in her palaces for a refuge. As we have heard, so have we seen in the city of the Lord of hosts, in the city of our God. (**Refrain**)

Verse: Glory... Both now... (**Refrain**)

- **The Second Antiphon**

Verse: The Most High hath sanctified His tabernacle. Holiness and majesty are in His sanctuary.

Refrain: Save us, O Son of God, Who art risen from the dead; who sing to Thee. Alleluia.

Verse: This is the gate of the Lord, the righteous shall enter in thereat. (**Refrain**)

Verse: Holy is Thy temple, and wonderful in righteousness. (**Refrain**)

Verse: Glory... Both now... O, only begotten Son and Word of God...

- **The Third Antiphon**

Even the rich among the people shall entreat thy favor. The King’s daughter is all glorious within: her clothing is of wrought gold. Virgins shall be brought to the King after her: her companions shall be brought unto Thee.

- *During the Little Entrance, after the verses of the Third Antiphon above, chant the Apolytikion of the **Entrance of the Theotokos below.***

- *The Eisodikon (Entrance Hymn) is “O come, let us worship... save us, O Son of God, Who art risen from the dead...” as on ordinary Sundays. After the Little Entrance, chant the following:*

RESURRECTIONAL APOLYTIKION IN TONE SEVEN

Thou didst shatter death by Thy Cross, Thou didst open paradise to the thief; Thou didst turn the sadness of the ointment-bearing women into joy. And didst bid Thine Apostles proclaim a warning, that Thou hast risen O Christ, granting to the world the Great Mercy.

APOLYTIKION OF THE ENTRANCE OF THE THEOTOKOS IN TONE FOUR

Today the Virgin is the foreshadowing of the pleasure of God, and the beginning of the preaching of the salvation of mankind. Thou hast appeared in the Temple of God openly and hast gone before, preaching Christ to all. Let us shout with one thrilling voice, saying: Rejoice, O thou who art the fulfillment of the Creator's dispensation.

APOLYTIKION OF SAINT GEORGE IN TONE FOUR

Since thou art a liberator and deliverer of captives, a help and support of the poor and needy, a healing physician of the sick, a contender and fighter for kings, O great among martyrs, the victory-clad George: Intercede with Christ God for the salvation of our souls.

KONTAKION OF ENTRANCE OF THE THEOTOKOS IN TONE FOUR

The sacred treasury of God's holy glory, * the greatly precious bridal chamber and Virgin, * the Savior's most pure temple, free of stain and undefiled, * into the House of the Lord * on this day is brought forward * and bringeth with herself the grace * of the Most Divine Spirit; * her do God's Angels hymn with songs of praise, * for she is truly the heavenly tabernacle.

• **The Scripture of the day, following the Trisagion Hymn:**

THE EPISTLE (For the Twenty-fourth Sunday after Pentecost)

Clergy: Let us attend!

Reader: *The Lord will give strength to His people. Ascribe to the Lord, O sons of God, ascribe to the Lord honor and glory.*

Clergy: Wisdom!

Reader: **The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Ephesians. (2:14-22)**

Clergy: Let us attend!

Reader: Brethren, Christ is our peace, Who has made us both one, and has broken down the dividing wall of hostility, by abolishing in His flesh the law of commandments and ordinances, that He might create in Himself one new man in place of the two, so making peace, and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the Cross, thereby bringing the hostility to an end. And He came and preached peace to you, who were far off, and peace to those who were near; for through Him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then you are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus Himself being the cornerstone, in Whom the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in Whom you also are built into it for a dwelling place of God in the Spirit.

Clergy: Peace be to thee, who readest.

Reader: And to thy spirit.

Choir: *It is good to give thanks to the Lord, to sing praises to Thy name, O Most High!
To declare Thy mercy in the morning, and Thy truth by night!*

All: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

THE GOSPEL (For Ninth Sunday of Luke)

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke. (12:16-21)

The Lord spoke this parable: “The land of a rich man brought forth plentifully; and he thought to himself, ‘What shall I do, for I have nowhere to store my crops?’ And he said, ‘I will do this: I will pull down my barns, and build larger ones; and there I will store all my grain and my goods. And I will say to my soul, Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; take your ease, eat, drink, be merry.’ But God said to him, ‘Fool! This night your soul is required of you; and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?’ So is he who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God.” As He said this, Jesus called out, “He who has ears to hear, let him hear.”

Advent Fast – Nothing from an animal with a backbone (*Except at Thanksgiving*)

Fasting is a simple way of saying Regulated Consumption. Fasting restores our relationship with God by directing us away from our physical desires and instead focusing on spending time with God. This regulation of our consumption also develops maturity in our personal life to be patient through self-control, to make wise decisions through discipline, and to enjoy food, drink and relationships in a measured responsible manner. Restraint is the path to a good life. However, these only are edifying to our souls if they become a means of prayer to God every time we practice restraint. St. Paul identifies this self-control as one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit: “The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control” (*Gal. 5:23*). Being hungry is a sign to pray – to be in communion with God. We eat out of necessity. Do we give the same concern to feed our souls? Fasting teaches us that we do not belong to this world. Fasting is a spiritual weapon against temptations of this world. Fasting keeps us awake, helps to be watchful – to keep vigil for the Bridegroom, Christ. If you’ve ever seen a picture of the Three Monkeys, they teach us to Fast from Evil through our eyes, ears, & speech. As Christ says in the desert to the devil, Man lives not by bread alone, but by the Word of God. (*Matthew 4:4*) *Fasting is an important spiritual struggle that carries us into the Kingdom of God. Combined with increased prayer and almsgiving, fasting helps us to say ‘no’ to the bodily desires in order to say ‘yes’ to the spiritual riches of the virtues of Christ.*



Advent Prayer: O Lord Jesus Christ, our God and hope of all on land and of those far away at sea or in the air, Thou hast established these holy days of fasting by Thy law and the prophets, as a way for our humbling unto repentance. At the proper time, Thou didst manifest Thyself in the flesh on this earth, and by Thy fast of forty days and nights, Thou didst sanctify the practice of fasting and command us to follow Thine example. As a merciful and gracious God, enable us to continue in these holy days of this Fast with perfect repentance, with humility instead of hypocrisy, with fervent prayer, with hunger and thirst, with frequent prostrations, and with a contrite heart. Enable us also to complete this time of this Fast without fault and with a pure conscience, keeping our faith intact and achieving victory over sin. Send us an angel of peace to watch over our lives, to protect us from all snares of the enemy, and to assist us in the performance of good deeds. Convert our indifference and apathy for our family, our parish, and our neighbor into care and compassion. Strengthen us by Thy power so that we may accomplish the spiritual works of this Fast. Then, with our passions in control and our souls and bodies properly cleansed, we may partake, without condemnation, of Thy most pure Body and Thy most precious and life-giving Blood. For Thou art the merciful and gracious Lover of Mankind Who came down to earth to save all; and we give glory to Thee and Thine Eternal Father and Thine all-holy gracious, and life-giving Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.
