

• The "Glory" hymns at the end of Matins: THE DOXASTICON OF PALM SUNDAY IN TONE SIX

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; both now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany; and His disciples came to Him, saying unto Him: Lord, where wilt Thou that we prepare for Thee to eat the Passover? And He sent them, saying: Go into the village over against you, and ye shall find a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, and say to the master of the house: The Teacher saith: I will keep the Passover at thy house with My disciples.

APOLYTIKION OF PALM SUNDAY IN TONE FOUR

As by baptism we were buried with Thee, O Christ our God, so by Thy Resurrection we were deemed worthy of immortal life; and praising Thee, we cry: Hosanna in the highest; blessed is He that cometh in the Name of the Lord.

• The Hymns of the Day during the Divine Liturgy of Saint John Chrysostom: THE GREAT LITANY & THE FIRST ANTIPHON:

Verse: I am filled with joy, for the Lord will hear the voice of my supplication. The anguish of death encompassed me; the perils of hell beset me.

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

Verse: I found tribulation and anguish, and I called upon the Name of the Lord. I will walk acceptably before the Lord in the land of the living. (*Refrain*)

Verse: Glory to the Father... Both now and ever... (**Refrain**)

THE LITTLE LITANY & THE SECOND ANTIPHON:

Verse: I believed, and therefore have I spoken: but I was deeply humiliated. What shall I render unto the Lord, for all His benefits unto me?

Refrain: Save us, O Son of God, Who didst sit upon the foal of an ass, who sing to Thee. Alleluia.

Verse: I will take the cup of Salvation, and call upon the Name of the Lord. (**Refrain**)

I will pay my vows unto the Lord in the presence of all His people. (*Refrain*)

Verse: Glory to the Father... Both now and ever... O, only begotten Son and Word...

Verse: O, give thanks unto the Lord, for He is good: for His mercy endureth forever. Let the house of Israel now say that He is good: for His mercy endureth forever. Let the house of Aaron now say that He is good: for His mercy endureth forever. Let all that fear the Lord now say that He is good: for His mercy endureth forever.

APOLYTIKION OF LAZARUS SATURDAY IN TONE ONE:

In confirming the common Resurrection, O Christ God, Thou didst raise up Lazarus from the dead before Thy Passion. Wherefore, we also, like the children, bearing the symbols of victory, cry to Thee, the Vanquisher of death: Hosanna in the highest; blessed is He that cometh in the Name of the Lord.

THE EISODIKON (ENTRANCE HYMN) OF PALM SUNDAY:

Priest: Blessed is He Who cometh in the Name of the Lord: God is the Lord and hath appeared unto us. Save us, O Son of God, Who didst sit upon the foal of an ass; who sing to Thee. Alleluia.

All: Save us, O Son of God, Who didst sit upon the foal of an ass; who sing to Thee. Alleluia.

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• After the Little Entrance (Eisodos), sing these Apolytikia in the following order.

APOLYTIKION OF LAZARUS SATURDAY IN TONE ONE

In confirming the common Resurrection, O Christ God, Thou didst raise up Lazarus from the dead before Thy Passion. Wherefore, we also, like the children, bearing the symbols of victory, cry to Thee, the Vanquisher of death: Hosanna in the highest; blessed is He that cometh in the Name of the Lord.

APOLYTIKION OF PALM SUNDAY IN TONE FOUR

As by baptism we were buried with Thee, O Christ our God, so by Thy Resurrection we were deemed worthy of immortal life; and praising Thee, we cry: Hosanna in the highest; blessed is He that cometh in the Name of the Lord.

• Do NOT sing the apolytikion of the patron saint or feast of the temple.

KONTAKION OF PALM SUNDAY IN TONE SIX

Being borne upon a throne in Heaven, and upon a colt on the earth, O Christ God, Thou didst accept the praise of the angels and the laudation of the children as they cried to Thee: Blessed art Thou Who comest to recall Adam.

PRAYER & THE TRISAGION HYMN

• The Scripture of the day:

THE EPISTLE:
THE EPISTLE (For Palm Sunday)

Clergy: Let us attend!

Reader: Blessed is He Who cometh in the Name of the Lord.

O give thanks unto the Lord, for He is good; for His mercy endures forever.

Clergy: Wisdom!

Reader: The Reading from the Epistle of Saint Paul to the Philippians. (4:4-9)

Clergy: Let us attend!

Reader: Brethren, rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice! Let your forbearance be known to all people. The Lord is at hand. Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your petitions be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are honorable, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report; if there is any virtue, and if there is any praise, think about these things. The things which you both learned and received, and heard and saw in me, these things do; and the God of peace will be with you.

Clergy: Peace be to thee, who readest.

Reader: And to thy spirit.

Choir: O sing to the Lord a new song, for He has done marvelous things!

All the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God.

All: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

THE GOSPEL (For Palm Sunday)

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Saint John. (12:1-18)

Six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus who had died was, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. There they made Him a supper; Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at table with Him. Mary took a pound of costly ointment of pure nard and anointed the feet of Jesus and wiped His feet with her hair; and the house was filled with the fragrance of the ointment. But Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, one of His Disciples (he who was to betray Jesus), said, "Why was this ointment not sold for three hundred denarii and given to the poor?" This he said, not because he cared for the poor but because he was a thief, and as he had the moneybox he used to take what was put into it. Jesus said, "Let her alone, let her keep it for the day of My burial. The poor you always have with you, but you do not always have Me." When the great crowd of the Jews learned that He was there, they came, not only on account of Jesus but also to see Lazarus, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. So the chief priests planned to put Lazarus also to death, because on account of him many of the Jews were going away and believing in Jesus. The next day a great crowd who had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying, "Hosanna! Blessed is He Who cometh in the Name of the Lord, the King of Israel!" And Jesus found a young ass and sat upon it; as it is written, "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on an ass's colt!" His Disciples did not understand this at first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that this had been written of Him and had been done to Him. The crowd that had been with Jesus when He called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead bore witness. The reason why the crowd went to meet Jesus was that they heard He had done ++++++ this sign.

• Instead of "It is truly meet" sing the Megalynarion for Palm Sunday in Tone 4: God is the Lord and hath appeared unto us; ordain a feast, and rejoicing, come let us magnify Christ with palms and branches, crying out with hymns: Blessed is He that cometh in the Name of the Lord, our Savior.

After "One is Holy, One is Lord..." & "I Believe O Lord and I Confess..." Then sing the following Hymns in Tone 8:

Rejoice and be happy, O city of Zion. Be joyful and glad, O Church of God; for behold, thy King is come sitting upon a colt and praised by youth. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed art Thou Who art possessed of bountiful mercies: have mercy upon us.

Today hath the Savior come to Jerusalem to fulfill the Scriptures; and all did take in their hands branches of palm trees. And they spread their clothes for Him, knowing that it was He, our Lord, to Whom cherubim unceasingly call out, Hosanna in the highest. Blessed art Thou Who art possessed of bountiful mercies: have mercy upon us.

O Thou Who ridest upon the cherubim, and Who art praised by the seraphim, Thou didst ride upon a colt, O holy, Davidic One. And the youths were praising Thee as befitteth God. And the Jews did blaspheme against Thee wickedly. Thy sitting on an ass foreshadowed the transformation of the bolting of the Gentiles from infidelity to faith. Glory to Thee, O Christ, Who alone art merciful and the Lover of mankind.

THEN THE KOÍNONIKÓN (COMMUNION HYMN) FOR PALM SUNDAY:

Blessed is He Who cometh in the Name of the Lord. Alleluia.

• Instead of "We have seen the true light", sing:

THE APOLYTIKION OF LAZARUS SATURDAY IN TONE ONE

In confirming the common Resurrection, O Christ God, Thou didst raise up Lazarus from the dead before Thy Passion. Wherefore, we also, like the children, bearing the symbols of victory, cry to Thee, the Vanquisher of death: Hosanna in the highest; blessed is He that cometh in the Name of the Lord.

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• After "Blessed be the Name of the Lord", the Procession begins and the choir sings the Apolytikia of Lazarus Saturday and Palm Sunday, and "Rejoice, O Bethany".

Rejoice, rejoice, O Bethany! * On this day **God came to thee**, ** <u>And</u> in Him the dead are made alive, * As it is right for **He is the Life**....

When Martha went to receive Him, * Grieving loudly with **bitter tears**, ** <u>She</u> poured out the sorrow of her heart to Him * With great sadness, **wailing her lament**....

She at once cried out unto Him: * "My most compassionate Lord, **my Lord**, ** <u>At</u> the great loss of my brother Lazarus * My heart is broken, **help me**."...

Jesus said to her, "Cease your weeping, * Cease your grieving and **sad lament**; ** <u>For</u> your brother, My most beloved friend, Lazarus, * Very soon (he) will live again."...

Then He, the faithful Redeemer, * Made His way unto the tomb, ** Where he cried unto him who was buried four days, * Calling him forth, saying "Lazarus, arise."...

Come with haste, ye two sisters, * And behold a **wondrous thing**, ** For your brother from the tomb has returned to life. * To the beloved Redeemer **now give thanks**....

To Thee, O Lord of creation, * We kneel down in **reverence profound**, ** <u>For</u> all we who are dead in sin, * In Thee, O Jesus, (we) are made alive....

COMMEMORATION: He Who accepted to make the foal of a donkey His throne.
